FUCHSIA DEPLOYMENT is a specific site installation created to be suspended in the ex-industrial airspace of Tour & Taxis Brussels, inspired by the shed and its impressive reticulated steel structure from the beginning of the last century. The work displays from its center 7000 meters of colored lines materialized with ropes. It has a landscape view where it dialogues with the space created by the shed. When approaching the work its kinetic part becomes protagonist that invites to cross it and to recognize the different geometric compositions that are generated from different points of view.

WINGED FOREST












WINGED FOREST was created to interact with the trees of a public park in the City of Buenos Aires. It was inspired by the flight of the birds that inhabit the trees. It consists of two X-shaped bodies located along the grove that are materialized with white ropes fixed to groups of steel masts. Its geometry in the form of overlapping triangles resembles unfolding wings. The white colour of the ropes contrasts with the shadows created by the grove and it is also a reference to the white color of LAS NEREIDAS sculpture, one of the most famous historical monuments in the city of Buenos Aires















RED FLOWER is inspired by the flower of the ceibo tree. Taking its ogival geometry as its origin and repeating it radially creating a star shape. This star materializes with thousands of translucent red lines and rises on steel masts from 3 meters to 8 meters. It's elevation and height allows to be visible from a long distance and also to be traversable and permeable to pedestrian circulation. It was exhibited in the Children's Park located in front of the Río de la Plata. In that location had different dialogues with the environment and the public. From a long distance it was possible to have a landscape vision of the elevated art work between the tops of the ceibo trees, looking like part of them and having the Río de la Plata as a background. In the middle distance was related to the ceibo tree and its flower. In close distance, the public was able to discover the multiple geometries that compose it. From it's inside, a sensory perception was achieved that transmits the play of the translucent materiality of the work and the sun.





INTO THE GREEN









The proposal with the work **INTO THE GREEN** was to generate a space of interrelation between the public square of the tiown Puertos del Lago and the immense nature space that surrounds it. I built three interconnected pyramids that pointed towards the horizon. These pyramids were materialized with 50 km of green translucent mesh, which captured the light of the place, and the public upon entering the work was inside this green light materiality. This luminosity tried to function as a vehicle to connect the urban space of the square with the natural space.

AUTUMN REVERSED















AUTUMN REVERSED is an intervention of urban trees. It aims to bring back the autumn colors in the winter season. The intention is to provide an unexpected landscape, in this case the autumn colors during winter. To reproduce the autumn landscape the work has hundred of color lines through the naked tree branches, creating a geometric tree crown. Geometry in contrast with the organic forms oftrees, emphasizes the relationship between human and nature. Trees, human intervention and urban space work as one and make us think the city as a natural ecosystem. In this effort to recover the autumn colors, Autumn Reversed became a subtle desire to recover something lost after time passed.

TECHNICAL MEMORY

5 wired prisms (each 20 meters long). Prisms are placed transversal to the tree lines and will use 5 pairs of trees. Each prism contains 100 color lines (3mm polyamide wire), which go though the tree crowns and are confined on a square of 1.8 x 1.8 meters. These prisms are supported by wooden structures.





BEACH ART proposes to mount an installation in various opportunities and at different places and will be moved from one place to another to share with people its itinerant and ephemeral character, needed to be related to the temporary essence of the beach. Moving sands, dunes, tides, cliffs erosion by the sea and the wind, constant weather changes making the coast a place where the changing dynamics of nature and its elements is felt. Like a boat mooring at the port, in the "time-space" at which the installation stops and is secured to the beach sand, a space is generated to meet with nature, with others and with ourselves. During this stop the energy of coastal nature is evidenced is materialized being transformed in color with life color with movement and energy. This work of art stops at a place adapts to it interacting with the elements which identifies it (wind, sand, sun, sea). The wind gives shape and energy to it, is its true creator. The beach sand provides a bed to settle, is the land from which it will depart. The sun plays with lights and shadows emphasizing the movement and the different shapes that the work of art begins to take.
